


- To develop, test and analyze alternative methods of processing and transporting of non-machinable outsides using a Supplier resulting in increased efficiencies and improved service
- Leverage Supplier automated package network




POSTAL SERVICE® Physical Dimensions of Mail Pieces

USPS Automation



32" high



If the parcel exceeds any of these dimensions then the parcel is classified as an NMO

> 35 pounds max weight


70 pounds max weight



- Six month pilot
- Pilot sites: Des Moines & Chicago NDC Service
- Includes Originating Tier 3 volumes from Cincinnati, Kansas City, Minneapolis, and St Louis NDC's
- Supplier will provide the middle mile
- USPS will maintain first and last mile
- Supplier will tender package to DDU or Plant
- Increased End-to-end scanning visibility for customer
- Unions have been notified at National level




Originating NMOs

Destinating NMO Mail Flow





- Contract awarded to UPS for Pilot
- Packages will flow through Supplier automation that is geared to large parcels
- Supplier will deliver parcels directly to 18,000 DDU's
- Supplier has over 800 facilities and 288 hub locations
- Pilot begins this week
 - Packages will begin to arrive at destinating DDU's and Plants nationally



- Supplier scanning work stations at pilot sites
- USPS will perform the scan for Dual-agency label
- Dual agency label applied to NMO
- USPS will transport NMO's to Supplier facility
- Approximately 1500 3-Digit ZIP Codes will be delivered to Plants not serviced by Supplier
- Offshore will be delivered to the USPS facility utilizing L601 labeling list



Dual Agency Label





- Plants will receive destination NMOs for DDUs not served directly by Supplier
- The Supplier's driver will arrive at Plant dock with NMO shipment of few pieces
- No appointment required
 - Expedite driver in and out
 - 8125 not required
 - USPS employee verify shipment
 - Provide electronic signature for driver



Plant Receipt from Supplier

- After receipt from the Supplier
 - Route shipment to incoming manual NMO distribution area after receiving
 - Manual distribution employee scan each NMO for enroute scan
 - Dispatch to DDU
- DDU's will receive with SurePost
 - Follow same process as accepting Surepost



- Communicate to employees
- New Process for Plant personnel
 - Do not reject mail make sure electronic signature provided to Supplier for delivery
 - May not receive shipments each day
- Provide Stand up talks to all employees
